Sew Both together after $2\frac{1}{2}$ " triangle
is sewn to $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Square

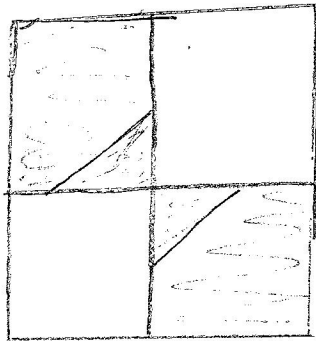
- Bottom Sew Both together after $2\frac{1}{2}$ " triangle
is sewn to $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Square

Construction

$8\frac{1}{2}$ " Block you will need:

- 4- $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Squares (two of Background fabric and 2 for the bowtie)
- 2- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Squares for the bowtie)

Completed Block $8\frac{1}{2}$ " sq.



Specifically, the "Bow tie block" was a symbol indicating it was necessary to travel in disguise or to change from the clothing of a slave to those of a person of higher status.
